Elida Build Update





ONU Workweek Transformation



While we are still in great need of more volunteers at the ReStore, a huge transformation happened from August 19-24. Ohio Northern University offers the opportunity for students to come to campus a week before classes begin, but they must be willing to volunteer during that week. The ONU Student Chapter of Habitat for Humanity organizes projects during the week for the students with the vast majority coming to help at our Lima Area Habitat. We had up to 56 students per day during the week. In total, almost 900 volunteer hours were given. Many projects that are impossible to complete with our regular volunteers were finished in quick order by this large group of students, plus the overflowing piles of donations became manageable tasks by the end of the week. The energy, joy, and generosity of these young adults was immeasurably valuable to the affiliate. Do you have a group who would be willing to come be a part of a work day?
