Grace Youth Auction Benefits Habitat

Last year, Grace Mennonite Youth Fellowship in Pandora raised almost \$2700 for Habitat-Lima through an auction and matching gifts from church members and the Mennonite Mutual Aid Association. Their gift provided 22 Memberships in Club 1000 and was a tremendous achievement. Many probably wondered what they could possibly do for an encore!!

This year, once again, they decided to do another auction and donate half the proceeds to Habitat. The auction was held at the church on Saturday, November 7, and was an overwhelming success - raising over \$6000 (in total) and \$3009 for Habitat in Lima. Since then, we have also received \$500 from the Mennonite Mutual Aid Association on behalf of the Youth Group.

We cannot say enough to thank these dedicated young people and their adult leaders. They are truly a blessing and an example for all of us in carrying out our housing ministry.

Annual Planning Meeting

On Saturday, November 14, the Habitat Board of Directors and Executive Director met to lay plans for 1999 and beyond. The primary focus was on "What will it take to build three Houses in 1999 and get ourselves prepared for an even bigger schedule in future years?"

This focus generated almost 40 action items from attendees! These items were assigned to nine committees for action and provide a base for committee goals in 1999. It is an ambitious program; but with God "all things are possible."

As we proceed into the New Year, we will be sharing these plans with our Habitat Partners and praying that you will join with us to make them a reality.





Tithing Expresses Our Faith

Tithing is fundamental to the success of Habitat for Humanity, both in Lima and around the World. Just as many of our supporters tithe from their resources, Habitat-Lima shares its resources with others in need throughout the World. Ten percent of our unrestricted donations goes to Habitat International to support its Housing Ministry overseas. In 1998, we gave over \$6500.00, our largest contribution to date.

For every Habitat House built in the United States, there are 2 houses built overseas. In some countries our tithe this year could build three or four simple, decent houses. We are truly blessed with many generous and caring partners who support our work and make it possible to share our blessings with families in need in over fifty (50) countries.

An Incredible True Story from Alliance, Ohio

One year ago our affiliate was fortunate to experience the glory of Habitat's Christian ministry. We were \$10,000 short of finishing our seventh house. Christmas was two weeks away, and we had disappointed the family who had hoped to move in for the holiday. Spirits were low. At the December meeting of the Trustees, we were faced with a dilemma: pay our \$2500 tithe or work on the house.

The Trustees unanimously voted to pay the tithe. It is our obligation to this ministry, they said. They left the meeting comforted by the thought that all of God's children are deserving of a home, and though we will not likely meet the family whose house is built with the tithe, the Lord loves them with the same benevolence for the residents of Alliance.

Two weeks later we received a phone call. It was an anonymous donor who offered us the funds to finish the house, and a knowledgeable contact person to administer his funds for the build.

His contact, Roy Koehn, worked with our site supervisor, Charles Eynon, and they finished the home quickly. Pastor Koehn has built two other homes with us since and is working on blueprints with our site supervisors and others. The blessing grows and grows.

In the month following our donor's windfall, foundation support rolled in by the tens of thousands. We were suddenly planning a five-house project that doubled the amount of tithe money we will be sending. That single tithe decision changed the dynamic of our affiliate. The Lord's blessing for having chosen our tithe catapulted us to a higher level of building ministry. Praise God! 
Habitat Celebrates and Dedicates the Oprah House
